School Development Plan Priorities 2022-2024

We have 6 priorities, each of which are aligned to one of the OFSTED criteria; *Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Leadership and Management* and *Personal Development*.

Quality of Education

Priority 1: Successfully embed a new validated Phonics Scheme We will achieve this by:

- Training all staff to successfully deliver Little Wandle phonics lessons
- Sharing information about Little Wandle with parents and carers through workshops and visits into school
- Continuing to carefully select books so that pupils can read confidently, fluently and apply the phonics they have been taught
- Continuing to provide daily systematic, progressive phonics teaching in Reception and Year 1
- Continuing to provide rapid catch-up sessions for pupils in Year 2 and 3 who did not pass the phonics screening check

Priority 2: Develop the Science Curriculum across the school We will achieve this by:

- Focusing staff professional development time on improving science subject knowledge, including retrieval practice
- Continuing to network with other science leads to moderate and share good practice
- Continuing to raise awareness of science across the school, with a dedicated science enrichment week

Priority 3: Continue to make sure all pupils are reaching their potential in writing

We will achieve this by:

- Regularly referring to the writing targets in pupils' books to support pupils' progression towards achieving these
- Regularly monitoring English books as part of the schools' monitoring schedule
- Facilitating internal and external writing moderation, to support teachers' professional development

Behaviour and Attitudes

Priority 4: Encourage pupils' positive attitude to education We will achieve this by:

- Completing a pupil survey and draw up an action plan upon analysis of the results
- Producing a new Behaviour Policy, with staff input to help embed a consistent approach across the school
- Encouraging a growth mindset in class, using the Zone of Proximal Development, where success is measured through effort and mistakes are welcome

Leadership and Management

Priority 5: Continue to develop strong leadership structures across the school

We will achieve this by:

- Creating carefully sequenced and progressive 'Road Maps' and Medium-Term Plans
- Completing subject specific action plans, including outlining key priorities
- Conducting monitoring activities in all subject areas
- Planning and organising subject specific enrichment activities for the whole school
