Focus	Estimated Cost	Planned Impact / Objectives for 2025–2026
Insignis School Sports Partnership	£1800	Continue to strengthen pupil engagement through an increased variety of sports festivals and tournaments. Encourage more pupils to represent the school and build confidence in competitive sport. PE Lead (RS) will attend the annual Sports Conference and three network meetings to share good practice and bring back new ideas for school improvement. Join in with new sports e.g. Handball and introduce these to the school.
'Get Set 4 PE' Planning Resource	£660	Ensure all staff use high-quality planning to deliver consistent, skill-based PE lessons. Embed clear progression across year groups and further support new staff with planning tools and video examples. Continue to refine long-term plans to maintain high-quality delivery.
Sports Equipment	£1400	Invest in new and replacement equipment to support a wider range of sports and activities. Focus on inclusive resources so all pupils, including those with

		additional needs, can participate fully. Equipment will align with the school's PE curriculum to promote breadth and enjoyment. Buy handball equipment so that children can practise for competitions.
Inter-House Competitions	£300	Expand the inter-house competition programme with new sports and regular termly events. Increase pupil motivation through recognition and rewards for effort, teamwork, and sportsmanship.
Premier Sports	£9,324	Maintain the partnership with trained coaches to deliver engaging, high-quality PE lessons. Continue to use sessions for teacher professional development and mentoring. Focus on developing staff confidence in leading independent PE lessons.
Transport for Sports Competitions	£1000	Provide transport so that pupils can attend local and regional sporting events. Aim to increase the number of children participating in off-site competitions, ensuring equal access for all year groups.
Sports Leaders and Playground Equipment	£1000	Recruit and train new Sports Leaders to deliver structured, active play sessions during break and lunch times. Purchase additional equipment to
